Some flowers survive winter

Together, we can change things.

IT WON'T be long before spring wildflowers will carpet woodlands around southeastern Michigan. I can just visualize the fields of daisies by Schoolcraft College and the clouds of large white trillium along Hines Parkway that I saw last year.

But, surprisingly enough, even now I can walk through fields of wildflowers at the Troy Nature Center or at Oakwoods Metro Park. The flowers may not be blooming and showing their colorful petals, but I can enjoy the beauty of these "winter" wildflowers.

"Winter" wildflowers are actually the hard, dry, fibrous remains of the succulent, supple, green stems and flower parts of many common wildflowers we saw in summer. Most of these remains are from summer or fall blooming flowers. Early spring flower remains have all disappeared.

ONE "WINTER" wildflower commonly seen in local fields is the queen anne's lace. Tall, thin stems about three to four feet tall support small, branching stems that retain the general flat topped, lace-like appearance that characterizes the flowering plant in summer.

By now, the seeds of most plants have been dispersed, but the distinctive flowerhead shape still remains. Some queen anne's lace plants, however, are not flat topped; some are curled inward forming a cup-shaped head. The weather seems to cause

this closing of the flowerhead. It has inspired some people to call this plant bird's-nest weed.

IN ADDITION to the cup shape of the flowerhead, snow that fills the "nest" in winter would begin to melt away in the warming sun forming a small "egg" of snow inside. This phenomenon just added credence to the name bird's nest weed.

There are many plants that can be identified from their winter remains. Though the bright colors of the plant and flowers may be gone, the basic geometric shapes of the persistent flower parts provide their own beauty and means of identification.
