## face charges in shooting, robbery 2

An Inkster man on parole from Jack-son Prison was charged Tueday in the shoating of Livonia patrol officer Gre-gory Henderson on the Jeffries Free-way carly Monday. The Wayne County Prosecutor's Offi-ice Issued the warrants against James Douglas Barton, 32, charging him with assault with intent to commit murder and use of a firearm in the commission of a felony.

He was arraigned at his hospital bed-side in Westland Medical Center where side in Westland Medical Center Where he was taken for treatment of gunsholt wounds the day before. His condition was listed as fair, a hospital spokesper-son sald Wednesday. Police Identified two others involved in the shooting Monday as Arthur E. Sherman, a 25-year-old Garden City man, and Casimir Edward Bagaciunis, 20 of Westland.

SHERMAN WAS killed in the shoot-out while Bagaciunis was wounded by as many as three builets. Bagacianis was operated on for a builet to the chest Monday and yesterday was listed in fair condition at the Westland Medi-cal Center. The Livonin shoot-out followed a robbery in Farmington Hills in which police said the three men bound and terrorized two men and a woman for 3% hours.

Farmington Hills police Tuesday received warrants on Barton and Baga-ciunis for the drug-related robbery there. Barton is charged with three counts

Barton is charged with three counts of armed robbery, one count of first-degree criminal sexual conduct and four counts of use of a lirearm in com-mission of a felony (second offense). Bagaciunis is charged with three counts of armed robbery and three counts of felony firearm.

ACCORDING TO Chief William Dwyer of the Farmington Hills Police, three men broke into a bouse at 28708 Nine Mile at 11:55 pm. Studay and Hed up the two brothers who live there, Richard, 31, and Robert Shanklin, 26, and sexually assaulted the girlfriend of one of the men, a 17-year-old Detroit woman.

one of the men, a 17-year-old Detroit woman. "They continually threatened that they would be killed and pointed gans (a pistol and a saved-olf shoigun) at their beads,"said Dwyer. The men reportedly demanded drugs, money and other possessions in the bouse, ransacked it and then drove the woman to Rediord Community Hospi-tal, where two Detroit police officers overheard what had happened and en-couraged bin to call police. Meyer said Farmington police weren't notified of the robbery until af-ter 3 a.m. Livonia police list their first call of "an officer being down" at 2:56 a.m.

Henderson, 33, a 13-year decorated police veleran, is listed in poor but stable condition in the intensive are unit at the Westhand Medical Center. He was taken to the hospital with one gunshot wound to the check. The builde penetrated his left lung and then exited his body. Despite conflicting reports earlier this week, his condition did not worsen, said Livonin L4. Bobby L. Duren. No surgery was required. Duren said po-lice were "optimistic" that he would recever.

The shool-out occurred on the Jef-frics Freeway near Middlebelt fol-lowed a routine traffic atop by Livonia officers Henderson and Charles Baron-Klask, 42, shortly before 3 a.m. Duren said the officers were una-ware of the Farmington Hills incident when they stopped the 1978 red Thun-derbird for a traffic violation.
