GOLF LESSONS — Learn the basic fundamentals or improve your established skills through structured lessons to be held at Sliger Golf Range. Classes are 50 minutes long, meet twice each week for four weeks, and will begin May 21 for children and teens, adults and senior adults. Each participant will be asked to purchase a bucket of balls for each lesson. Registration should be made at the Parks & Recreation office, \$20 for children/teens and adults, and \$10 for senior adults.

INSTRUCTIONAL SPORTS CAMP — Instructional Sports Camp will again be offered this summer by the Farmington Hills Parks & Recreation and Oakland Community College. The camps will be held during the summer of 1985 at the Orchard Ridge Campus

In Farmington Hills. The Instructional Sports Camp is aimed at providing a personal approach to the development of skills and techniques particular to each sport.

Camp enrollment will be geared to a small student to instructor ratio, and will be available for both boys and girls of middle and high school age. Each individual will receive instruction in a natural progression suited to their needs. The camps will be offered on a one week basis meeting Monday through Friday for a total of 17.5 instructional hours per week at a cost of \$44 per camp, beginning the week of April 22. SAFETY TOWN REGISTRATION — This popular children's safety education program for 4-, 5- and 6-year olds will begin accepting registration for the summer session at the parks and recreation office. Session are at 9:30 a.m.-11:30 a.m. or 1-3 p.m. for five days a week for two weeks. The first session begins the week of June 17. A \$30 fee is required at the time of registration.

DETROIT SWIM TEAM — The Parks & Recreation Division invites you to join us for an evening of baseball Friday, June 28, as the Detroit Tigers take on the Toronto Blue Jays at 7:35 p.m. Transportation will be provided to and from the game and leaves City Hall at 5:45 p.m. and includes a reserved ticket. Registration is being taken on a first come, first serve basis at the Parks & Recreation office. Fee is \$12 per person.

RECREATION SWIM TEAM — Farmington area youth, ages 7-17, will

have the opportunity to swim on the Surf Skimmers Swim Team for the summer season. The swim team is for instructional purpose, although we do swim dual meets against other city teams and conclude with a final championship meet in August. A brief informational meeting will be held for all interested youth and parents at 7 p.m. Wednesday, June 12, at North Farmington High School. A \$24 registration fee is now being accepted at the Parks & Recreation office.

JUNIOR GOLF LESSON PROGRAM — The junior golf program is designed for all youth golfers, ages 9-17, who are interested in obtaining a comprehensive understanding of the game of golf. A five-session seminar will cover golf etiquette, proper fundamentals and basic golf strokes. 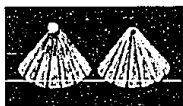

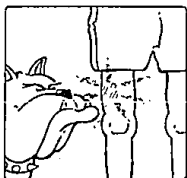
