**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON LEVY-
ING ADDITIONAL PROPERTY TAXES
AND ON THE PROPOSED FISCAL 85/86
CITY BUDGET.**

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills will hold a public hearing at 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 22, 1985, in the Council Chambers at City Hall, 31555 West Eleven Mile Road, on the proposed 1985 City Tax Levy and on the proposed 1985/86 City Budget. Copies of the proposed budget are available for public inspection during regular business hours in the office of the City Clerk, Farmington Hills Branch Library, 32737 West Twelve Mile Road, Farmington Hills, Michigan, and at the Farmington Branch Library, 23550 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan. All interested citizens are encouraged to attend and submit written or oral comments.

Last year (1984) the City levied \$7.6193 Mills (\$7.6193 per \$1,000 SEV) for City operations and capital improvements. Due to an increase in the State Equalized Value of existing property in the City, State Law (Act 5 of 1982) provides that the base tax rate for 1985 city operating and capital improvement taxes be reduced to \$7.1957 per \$1,000 Mills (\$7.1957 per \$1,000 SEV). This is \$4,236 Mills (\$4,236 per \$1,000 SEV) lower than the 1984 operating and capital tax rate.

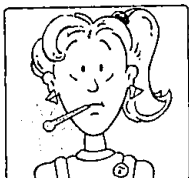
Presently, the City is authorized to levy \$9.8450 Mills for operating purposes.

With the proposed addition of police personnel, increased operating and service costs, and the City's commitments to drainage, local street and other public facility improvements, the City may be required to raise additional revenues by increasing tax millage.

For these and other reasons in order to fund the City's proposed 1985/86 Budget and to maintain essential services, meet debt obligations, provide capital improvements, the City may find it necessary to levy additional millage of up to \$1.2756 (\$1.2756 per \$1,000 SEV) above the 1984 base operating millage rate of \$7.1957 per \$1,000 SEV and will levy debt millage of \$.3287 per \$1,000 SEV. This additional millage would be allocated \$4,589 mills for operations and \$.8167 mills for capital improvements. This millage rate would provide an estimated increase of 6.4% in property tax revenues for operating purposes and 11.3% for capital improvements. The City has complete authority to establish the number of mills proposed to be levied from within its authorized millage rate.

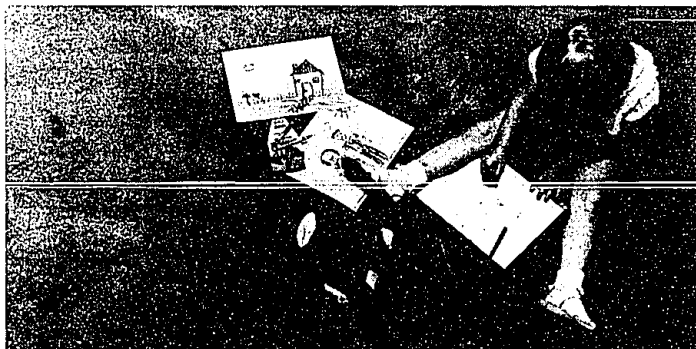
