Police said a 30-year-old Detroiter with a record of assaults and gun of-fenses fired a short-barreled shotgun at the nurse's car about 7 a.m. Tuesday.

HE WAS identified as Marcellus Wilkins who reportedly been released from the Northville State Psychiatric Hospital earlier this month. Det. Lt. Bobby Duren said the nurse, Persongia Barnes, 35, a Detroit resi-dent, had seen Wilkins two weeks ago

on Seven Mile near Grand River. Duren said the man was standing at the side of the road holding a sign with the words "to California" printed on it. He apparently recognized her and waved it at her as she drove by, she told po-lice.
