Waterford Oaks is on Scott Lake Road between Dixie Highway and Pontlac Lake Road west of Pontlac. It also boasts a court games complex with facilities for tennis, platform tennis, shuffleboard and grass volleyball.

Addison Oaks — overnight camping, modern, primitive and group campsites; 13 miles of trails for hiking; picnic areas, children's playground, swimming beach, rowboat and pedalboat renals, and a lake with fish. It's on W. Remeo Road nine miles north of Rochester.

Groveland Oaks — 600 modern and primitive campsites and group camping, modern restrooms and showers, convenience store, canoes, rowboats and pedal boats for rent; the usual picnic, swimming and playground facilities, plus a popular "Rampage" watercoaster that plunges tiders into Siewart Lake. It's at Dixie Highway and Granger Lial roats pear Holly.

Independence Onks — boasts a new Ted Gray Trall, with 8½ miles of marked hiking trail, and a new nature center, boat launch on Crooked Lake for non-motorized boats; rentals for canoes, pedal-boats and robboats; sandy beach with Higuards; the usual pienic areas and playground equipment. The largest (1,000-plus acres) county park, it's on Sashabaw Road 2½ miles north of 1-75 near Clarks-ton.
