Fitness and Health Fair will be under a canopy on Sinai's Outer Drive lawn. Hospital departments will sponsor exhibits, demonstrations and free counseling and health tests, including hypertension screening, cholesterol blood tests and glaucoma tests. There will be short workshops on stress reduction and relaxation techniques, information on sports medicine, and a physician referral service.
