As Heb Kalman, the matchmaker, Varrone is marvelous. While his Jaunty bowler and checked jacket (with matching skullcap) suggest a charla-tan. Varrone's twinkling eyes, jovial manner, and rich. booming voice make him a lovable rogue.

Anyone ever confronted with an un-desirable blind date will roar with rec-ognition when Varrone extols that "The Boy Is Perfect" while he glosses over Kuni-Lemi's failings: a binp, a squint, a hump, a stutter and a little deafness.

ZAGNIT, WHO created the title role in the New York production, does a masterful job of portraying all of Kuni-Lem's considerable imperfections. De-spite being the brunt of a lot of low humor, Zagnit embues his character with gentleness and sincerity.

Peterson and Larsen are both spirit-ed performers with strong voices, al-though Peterson's verges on harshness at times. Kolinski is convincingly car-nest as Max and has a pleasing voice. He also does a nice jub minicking Zag-nit's movements nit's movements.
