The Ron Gorchov exhibition of re-cent paintings at the Susanne Hilberry Gallery is a lavish explosion of color. Gorchov, who, since 1968, has ap-pilled his abstract color to shaped can-vases, creates a spatial tension be-tween painting and sculpture. The canwases are constructed, stapied and mounted on specially made thick, wood curved stretchers, ellmi-nating all corners in a shield-like shape.
