SERVICES IN THE COMMUNITY FOR PEOPLE WITH ARTHRITIS
 If you have arthritis, you should be informed about a number of health related services in the community that you can purchase.
 First, are the home health service agencies. These organizations provide nurses to supervise medication, physical therapists to direct exercise programs, and aides to assist in meals and housekeeping. In many instances cost of these services will be borne by Medicare.
 Second, a number of local stores carry products to assist you in daily activities such as bathing, dressing, meal preparation, and toilet care. We have catalogs that show these items and their cost. Unfortunately we do not have sufficient quantity for purchase or loan, but you are welcome to our office to review their contents.
 Third, are social workers in the community who can help you work through the problems of helping someone with arthritis to remain self sufficient in the home. The social worker will go to the individual's home, assess the person's needs, and arrange appropriate services.
 These counselors charge a fee, but in my experience the help you receive more than offsets the cost involved.
