**INSTRUCTIONAL SPORTS CAMP** — Instructional Sports Camp will be offered this summer by the Farmington Hills Parks & Recreation and Oakland Community College. The

camp will be held during the summer at the Orchard Ridge Campus in Farmington Hills. The purpose of the Instructional Sports Camp will be to provide a personal approach to the development of skills and techniques particular to each sport. Camp enrollment will be geared to a small student-to-instructor ratio, and will be available for both boys and girls of middle and high school age. Each individual will receive instruction in a natural progression suited to their needs. The camps will be offered on a one-week basis Monday-Friday for a total of 17.5 instructional hours per week

at a cost of \$45 per camp, beginning the week of June 17. For question, call the Parks & Recreation office at 474-6115 or the OCC Physical Education Department at 471-7715.

**DAY CAMP** — This camp is designed for nature lovers 6-12 years of age and provides both educational and recreational programs. Campers will be involved in animal study, insects, geology and plant life, as well as participation in camp craft, nature lore, archery, campfire programs, fishing and field trips. Time is 9:30 a.m. to 3:30

p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday, June 24-28; and 2-7:30 p.m. Thursday. Includes regular activities plus an evening picnic campfire program with camper's family. Session 1 June 24-28 \$25 and Session 2, July 1-5 (closed the 4th) \$28.

**JUNIOR GOLF LESSONS** — The Junior Golf program is designed for all youth golfers, ages 9-17, who are interested in obtaining a comprehensive understanding of the game of golf. A five-session seminar will cover golf etiquette, fundamentals and basic golf

strokes. Upon completion of the program, individuals will be eligible for the junior discount golf rate, golf tournament, leagues and other various items. A pre-registration fee of \$6 must be made at the Parks & Recreation office before June 14. The program will be 9-9:50 a.m. June 17, 19, 21, 24 and 25 at San Marino Golf Course.

**TENNIS LESSONS** — Learn the fundamentals of the game or improve your existing skills through structured lessons at Farmington or North Farmington High Schools. Classes are 50 minutes in length, twice each week for four weeks and will begin June 17, for children, teens, and adults. Each participant will provide tennis racket, shoes and a can of new tennis balls for the lessons. A \$20 registration fee should be made at the Parks & Recreation office.

**WESTERN HORSEBACK RIDING LESSONS** — Horses are fun and they can be even more enjoyable if you learn the basic skills of riding. Join our western riding lessons. Beginners and advanced classes are offered ages 8 and over both weekdays and Saturdays. Weekday classes meet twice a week for four weeks. Saturday classes meet once a week for eight weeks. Fee is \$55. Location: Windshire Equestrian Academy, Milford.

**FITNASTICS** — Enjoy toning your body to a formulated routine of exercise and dance. The twice-a-week sessions will meet 8:30-7:30 p.m. Monday and Wednesday beginning June 17 at the Plemontese Club, 38500 Nine Mile. The fee for this six-week session is \$25 and you may pre-register at the Parks and Recreation office.

**YOUTH SWIM LESSONS** — Swimming instruction for beginner to advanced skill levels will be offered at Farmington and North Farmington high schools. Each two-week session consists of daily classes which meet Monday-Thursday, Session 1, June 24 to July 3. Fee \$18. All children must be 38 inches at the chin in order to participate in swim lessons.

## Drinking-driving pamphlet offered

A new pamphlet, "How to Protect Yourself from Drinking Drivers," is available at all Secretary of State branch offices.

The pamphlet tells how to recognize drivers who may have been drinking,

when drinking drivers may be encountered on highways and what can be done to avoid them.

A total of 1,351 highway deaths occurred in Michigan in 1983 and 1,551 in 1984, said Secretary of State Richard

Austin. Alcohol was involved in more than half in both years.

Despite efforts of public and private agencies, law enforcement and safety organizations, alcohol-involved high-

way deaths have increased, he said.

The pamphlet is designed to help drivers become aware of the problems of drinking and driving, how to recognize a driver who has been drinking and how to protect yourself.

## Youths register for golf tourney

These tips could help any girl or boy, age 10 and younger, to win the 11th Annual Junior Golf Invitational at Springfield Oaks and White Lake Oaks golf courses Thursday, June 27, and Friday, June 28.

"We've sent out applications early this year so the players will have more time to practice," said Jim Mansfield, tournament director and Oakland County Parks and Recreation supervisor.

Cost for the event is \$15 for age 11 and younger, \$20 for age 12 and older.

"The price varies because the younger kids play nine holes each day, while the older ones play 18 holes each day," Mansfield explained.

Entry fee includes two practice rounds, one at each golf course, and lunch both days. Practice rounds can be played any weekday prior to June 27.

Trophies will be awarded to the first three places in each division.

"It's a medal competition which means there is no handicap. We just

take the three lowest scores," Mansfield said.

Mansfield expects 150-200 golfers who will play in two shifts, 6:45-9:30 a.m. and noon to 5 p.m. Players will be notified of their starting times.

Springfield Oaks is on Andersonville Road, at Hall Road in Davisburg. White

Lake Oaks is on Williams Lake Road off M-59, near Pontiac.

The next Oakland County Golf tournament is the One-Man Scramble July 27 at Springfield Oaks golf course.

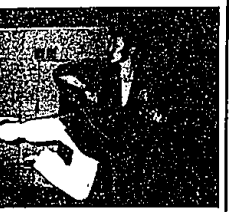
