Larkshire students win in national competition

A fifth-grade poet, a class of third graders and a troop of Brownies all from Larkshire Elementary School, have won national awards for their entries in Junior American Citizens contest sponsored by Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR).

Theresa Kuclo, took first place in the state, then third-place honors nationally for her poem, "Patriots of War."

Third graders, also first-place winners in Michigan, took an "Outstanding" award for their original song "Paul Revere." The "Outstanding" rating is given before the first-place award.

Also coming in for the "Outstanding" award nationally, after winning a first in the state contest, was Brownie Troop 3741's banner depicting Betsy Ross. The girls made the banner by weaving individual squares which were put together quilt-fashion.

Another group from Larkshire, Girl Scout Troop 3634, took a first place in the state competition with their pictorial essay on the life of Clara Barton.

All told, Larkshire students amassed 22 wins in the state competition, and three of those entries went on to win nationally.

THE DAR CONTEST was sponsored locally by Three Flags Chapter. All entries were submitted with the theme "Honor a Patriot 1776-1984," and were judged by category and by grade level.

The Junior Americans Citizens contests are open to all children, from preschool to high school. Contest categories include stickers, poetry, song, scrapbook, banner, video taping, genealogy and special projects.

The national winners were announced this spring in the DAR Building, in Washington, D.C., where the entries were on display.
