Famed Area Amusement Park Closes Doors

ONE OF THE oldest and most popular amusement centers in the area is now becoming just a memory. The 42-year-old Walled Lake Amusement Park permanently, closed its doors during the past week. The equipment was removed and a real estate company confirmed a report that

removed and a real estate company confirmed a report that the property is to be sold.

Mrs. Irene Whitworth, of the Gordon Williamson Muttl-Lake Real Estate Company, let it be known that the park's parking lot already had been sold and it is planned now for a subdiviston.

Removal of the equipment and the impending sale of the property signals the end of a long and colorith enterprise that was marred in recent years by poor attendance.

Built by Mr, and Mrs. Louis Tobettine, the casting passed into the hands of Mrs. Toletine and her nephew when her hus-

band died in 1936. She operated it until it was closed during World War II.

After the war, the brothers, Albert and Elmer Tolettne, re-opened the park in 1946 and featured big-name bands, With such famous names as Hal Kemp, the Doreys, Glem Miller, Sammy Kaye and Benney Goodman, the park prospered. Then, when the popularity of big bands faded, attendance dropped and the park slowly died the death of financial malnutrition.

state.

Latest to Join these supporting the amendment to the state constitution is State Senator Emil Lockwood (R, St. Louis), who spoke to the Ropublican women of Plymouth during the week.

SECRETARY OF STATE James M. Hare explained this week that voters who have recently moved into or out of the state of Michigan need not worry too much about losing their right to vote in the November election.

He cited what he termed "a far-reaching election law passed in 1985" which he said provides a two-way liberalization of ordinary residency restrictions.

He explained, for example, that qualified Michigan voters who move to other states but who can not qualify for residency because of lack of time, may now about for absentee voter balliots in Michigan to vote in the presidential election.
