

Foley Says Courts Not To Blame

John F. Foley, candidate for the Michigan Court of Appeals, issued a statement stating that "current attacks on the courts are red herrings misleading people from getting at the real causes of crime and disorder."
"Blaming courts for unsafe streets," Foley said, "is the answer of the demagogue because it gives him an inexpensive, easy solution to crime."
Foley made the remarks at a meeting of the Monroe County Bar Association. He is running in the Nov. 5 election for a vacancy in the court's Second District, which includes most of Southeastern Michigan.
He said that "according to the demagogue, crime is solved simply by removing coddling judges and installing tough ones."
"The real facts are that the courts are sending away criminals to the prisons as fast as the prisons can take them. In Michigan, over 80 percent of those charged with crimes plead guilty without a trial. Of the remaining, over 90 percent are convicted at trial. Of those who appeal, less than one per cent succeed in reversing their convictions. There are hardly the statistics of courts coddling criminals."
"The courts," he concluded, "generally are doing their job of providing fair trials. It is the essence of their limited role in establishing order. The lower crime rate in the suburbs is not caused by different courts there than the city courts. It is plainly caused by better economic and social conditions."

Pills And \$20 Taken In Theft

A Farmington medical office was robbed Sept. 11 by an unknown bandit who was not a fearless desperado but is concerned about his health.
Dr. H. J. Kattler reported to police that his office at 3236 City River was broken into sometime that night and \$20 in assorted bills, most of the office's birth control pills, and two Maelox tablets had been taken.
The office files and medical cabinets had been ransacked and the weight scales had been set at 94 1/2 pounds, police said.


