THE 19th NEVER got to cast an official vote. Its first vote of 83.5 to 43.4, with two abstemtions, was challenged by a delegate who asked for a poll of the delegation, The poll. was still going on when convention chairman Lucien Nedzi. Detroit congressman, saw that McNamara had received 1.370, or 200 more than a majority, and stopped the roll call. The unofficial, linal 19th District vote was 85.5 to 41 in 20 to Lesinski.
