

Police Officer 'Politics' For Nolan

and from work and parked in the township parking lot. The sticker read: "Nolan for Treasurer."

The complaint also alleges that a "certain identifiable high ranking police officer on the Farmington Township Police Force was seen removing a campaign sign at 12 Mile Rd. in Farmington Township and attempting to put it into his truck."

Kahn says the action of the unnamed officer was reported to Chief Yakes, but no action has been taken, and this constitutes a denial of equal protection under the law.

Also attached with the complaint was a letter allegedly signed by township patrolmen and sent to newspaper editors in the Farmington Area.

The letter was critical of Teeple's ability to be supervisor and contained the typewritten names of 28 township policemen.

THE UNSIGNED letter contained a petition signed by officers a year ago during the Teeple's Trial Board hearing. The letter was printed in the Interlake News and Pontiac Press. The Farmington

Enterprise & Observer rejected the letter because it was unsigned, a policy it applies to all letters received.

Kahn claims: "The content of this letter, if not promulgated by the township supervisor and other members of the township board, was known to exist by them and was condoned by them and that no action whatsoever has been taken to discipline the persons named in said letter nor the person that caused the rinting of the said letter which circulation and printing of is a distinct political activity."

Kahn claims that many of the alleged signers of the letter have denied signing it. If necessary, Kahn says, he will subpoena representatives of the Interlake News and Pontiac Press and entire township police force to discover the author of the letter. Ship administration "will, out of vengeance for the petitioner's (Teeple's) resounding victory... attempt to punish your petitioner for his successful candidacy and will attempt further acts of coercion to deprive your petitioner of his constitutional rights unless enjoined and restrained from doing so by this court."

The trial of Teeple's versus Farmington Township was to have been held today (Wednesday), said Kahn, but was adjourned because of the need to inform Judge Thorburn about the political activity of the other policemen.

WHILE ON THE trail, the scouts can participate in programs offered in 21 mountain camps by members of Philmont's 400-man staff. These programs include burro packing, horseback riding, gold panning, mining, archaeological study and digging, and advanced mountaineering.

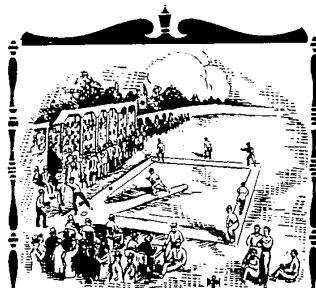
This summer, during the ranch's 32nd camping season, more than 17,000 Explorers and older Boy Scouts will take part in these and other activities.
