Mardiros Bucks UAW, Switches To McDonald

A year-long Democratic truce in the 19th Congressional District was shattered during the first half-hour of the party's state convention last week.

Ron Mardiros, Wayne-19th chairman, proclaimed four times that he will support Republican Jack McDonald for reelection to Congress.

Mardiros stated that Democratic candidate Fred L. Harris "shows he lacks leadership, doesn't understand governmental problems and is nothing but a puppet."

HE DIDN'T VENT his feeling openly, but rather, volunteered through his Observer-News reporter.

Told of Mardiros' remarks, Harris shot back, "Ron Mardiros is not the tall that was the dog. This district isn't geared to the whim of Ron Mardiros. These delegates can think for themselves."

The breach opened before a half-hour of the convention had elapsed.

aldo Vagnozzi, district chairman, was elected caucus chairman, as expected. With Mardiros absent, Vagnozzi's secretary called for caucus secretary nominations, specifying that the nominee "must be from Wayne County and have only one response although he repeated it for a total of three calls.

CHARLES DEAMUD of Redford Township, Secretary of state branch managers, association state chairman, nominated Mrs. George (Pat) Whitton of Edgwood. She was elected without opposition.

Eyebrows did go up however, because she and Vagnozzi are both labor union officials. Previous district rifts were over labor dominance, and Mardiros had led the anti-labor fight.

Campaigners Get College Credit

University of Michigan students who work in this fall election campaigns may be able to gain academic credit as well as political experience.

The U-M political science department and Institute of Public Policy Studies are jointly sponsoring "Elections 1970," a four-credit course which requires active campaign participation, in addition to attendance at a series of lectures and weekly discussion sessions.

The course is designed to combine work in the political campaigns with an analysis of current knowledge of voting behavior, public opinion, political organizations and elections.

CANDIDATES from both parties in the campaigns for the U.S. Senate, House of Representatives (primarily the 19th District), State Legislature, governorship and county commission will be asked if they would like students to work them.

If so, they will designate a liaison man to work with the

Arriving late, Mardiros bolted when he learned the situation. He leaned in front of two labor delegates and said he would support McDonald for Congress unless Mrs. Whitton's election were overturned.

JERRY FREEDMAN, a Farmington liberal, asked for reconsideration. The Freedman appeal was resoundingly defeated.

"Our leadership at the midnight caucus of Aldo Vagnozzi and Pat Whitton is not representative," Mardiros said.

As Mardiros came angrily down from the podium, this reporter asked him, "Are you pulling your people out?"

"I'M NOT PULLING my people out, but I'm pulling out. It's the oldest, cheapest political trick in the book. I'm supporting McDonald," stated Mardiros.

He told this reporter while the 19th was still in pre-convention caucus. "As far as I'm concerned, Fred Harris is responsible for this."

About Mardiros backing McDonald, Vagnozzi said, "This is strictly an internal party matter."

"I HAVE NEVER felt you should decide who should represent your district in Congress on the basis of party disputes. It's of little consequence to the public good."

"I would think the need to do something about unemployment, the war in Asia, education and other social programs are areas in which we need someone besides the present congressman."

"That should be much more important that the question of who attends a rather boring meeting at the end of a long day at convention," said Vagnozzi.

YPSILANTI A new vice-president for student affairs for Eastern Michigan University has been named by the Board of Regents.

He is James B. Campbell, who comes to Eastern from the post of vice-president for student personal services at Rochester (N.Y.) Institute of Technology. The selection committee was composed of faculty, staff and student members.

He succeeds Robert G. Zumwinkle, who resigned in June to take a similar position at the University of Kentucky at Lexington. Ralph Glendon, dean of admissions and financial aids at Eastern, has been named the student affairs office on an interim basis. The appointment is effective Sept. 1.

Campbell, a native of Milwaukee, is 29 years old. He received his bachelor's degree from Carroll College in Waukesha, Wisconsin, and the Master of Science and Doctor of Education degrees from Indiana University.
