Kresge Concerts Open In October

An array of guest artists will highlight the Detroit Symphony Orchestra's Kresge Concerts in Ford Auditorium this season. The popular-priced series will include programs devoted to opera, ballet, jazz and "pops." The concerts will be held on five Sunday afternoons at 3:30 p.m.

The opening Kresge Concert Oct. 11 will present duo-pianists Whittemore and Love performing Vaughn-Williams' Concerto for Two Pianos and Orchestra with the Symphony's new conductor-in-residence, Paul Freeman, conducting. Also included will be works by Gershwin, Tchaikovsky and Respighi.

Handel's "Messiah" will be the featured work on the

Kresge Christmas Concert Dec. 13. The performance will be conducted by Maynard Klein.

THE DETROIT SEVERO Ballet Company will present an entirely new production of Delibes' "Coppelia" Jan. 17. Pierre Hieu, the Symphony's newly appointed associate conductor will be on the podium.

Feb. 21 Sixten Ehrlich will conduct his first Detroit pops program with special guests. The Modern Jazz Quartet. Metropolitan Opera soprano Mary Costa returns to Detroit in a "Grand Finale" concert April 18 with Mr. Ehrlich conducting in a program of operatic music.

Season tickets may be ordered by mail at \$7.50, \$10.00 and \$12.50. Purchasers of season tickets may select the seats of their choice for all five concerts. Single tickets go on sale beginning Sept. 8 at \$1.50, \$2.00 and \$2.50.

20,000 Expected On Bridge Walk

The 13th annual Mackinac Bridge Walk will get under way a half hour earlier than usual, at 7:30 a.m., on Labor Day morning, Monday, Sept. 7, it was announced today by Prestiss M. Brown, chairman of the Mackinac Bridge Authority.

"Once again Gov. William Milliken will participate in the 'World's Greatest Walking Event' and weather permitting he'll lead close to 20,000 men, women, and children on the annual trek over the historic Straits of Mackinac," said Brown.

"The Labor Day Mackinac Bridge Walk has grown into a widely popular Michigan tradition since that rainy morning in 1958 when then-Gov. G. Mennen Williams led some 65 members of the International Walkers Association over the bridge. The popularity of the bridge walk, the only time pedestrians are permitted, has grown phenomenally - attracting people of all ages, from all walks of life and from all over the Midwest.

the main aim of the event, but for those who want to, the International Walkers Association will conduct speedwalk races for men, women, boys and girls with medals for winners, starting at 7:15 a.m. There is a

walk. The city by the Straits rolls out the red carpet annually for Labor Day walkers. The Pere Marquette Pageant, "The Black Gown Tree" is presented free of charge on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 4, 5, and 6. This is the dramatic production which depicts the life of Father Marquette, who founded St. Ignace 299 years ago and explored the Mississippi, opening up the Midwest for pioneers.

Bridge walkers are reminded that transportation northbound on Labor Day morning will be slow and congested. Walkers should keep this in mind. Nobody will be permitted to start walking after 10:00 a.m. and the bridge will be cleared of all walkers by noon. That is why being on the north side on the night before is so important.

NORTH AND SOUTH motor vehicle traffic is maintained during the walk on the two west lanes of the bridge. However, congestion often develops southbound and crossings are slowed down until noon. Travelers returning to the Lower Peninsula are advised to make their plans accordingly. It is not known whether Milliken will attempt to break Gov. George Romney's 47-minute record set in 1967, but he came within four minutes of doing it on his first try last year when he allowed as how he was "strolling" across the bridge.

Several politicians and staff members accompanying him were seen jogging and dogtrotting in their efforts to keep up with him. At any rate the Governor's Glass, a handsome trophy consisting of an engraved 16-ounce glass mounted on a polished maple block, is up for grabs again this year.

This season's program will include twice as many performances as last year. The 35 weeks will see eight of the world's greatest puppet troupes, eight big youth musicals and plays from New York, eight exclusive entertainments with music and dancers, three specials and eight free film shows, drawn from the prize-winning movies of the National Film Board of Canada.

This is the fourth season of professional entertainment for youngsters of all ages. Shows are given in school auditoriums, assembly halls and cafeterias, as well as the big auditorium of the Art Institute itself.

Theater Is Closed

The American Drama Festival Repertory Theater, previously scheduled to run through Sept. 12, has been closed. Although the theater itself was unharmed by the recent fire in the Henry Ford Museum, its interior has been officially ordered closed during the refurbishing of the damaged area of the museum directly behind the stage doors.

Viewers will have to wait until next year to see the opening of "Sherlock Holmes," scheduled for Aug. 10, but it is hoped that the theater will be open in time for the Christmas production.

Cleaning and resetting of the unharmed collections in the basement of the building is now complete, and the major portion of the Mechanical Arts Hall is reopened to the public. Automotive, railroad transportation, airplane collections, gun collections and the steam-powered machinery are also intact and open to visitors. The Decorative Arts Galleries in the front portion of the Museum were untouched and have been open to the public since the second day after the fire.
