

# Faculty Strike Delays S' craft Opening

Striking Faculty Forum members at Schoolcraft Community College have delayed the scheduled opening of registration, classes and freshman orientation at least one week.

Picketing instructors prevented the beginning of registration Monday, but Schoolcraft President Eric Brader had announced cancellation and "indefinite" postponement the night before.

He took the action after learning that the Forum voted Sunday night to "withhold services as of Monday, Aug. 24."

Larry VanderMolen, vice chairman of the Forum negotiating team, told Observer Newspapers that 95 percent of the Forum membership supported the action.

In addition to registration, classes were slated to begin Thursday of this week, and freshman night was scheduled for Thursday. Staff orientation was supposed to be held Monday and Tuesday of this week.

He took the action after learning that the Forum voted Sunday night to "withhold services as of Monday, Aug. 24."

Revised schedule can be established.

He labeled the disruption "strike action by the Faculty Forum, which is the bargaining agent for the instructors."

"We regret this situation has developed and will continue to do everything possible to reach contractual accord," he said.

In a statement issued by VanderMolen, the Forum stated its position is "no contract, no work."

The Forum and college bargaining teams have been working on a new contract since last January. Neither team has yet presented a tentative package for ratification.
