Something To Think About

CHOICE OF BURIAL VAULT

There are two broad uses for the term "burial vault." One refers to the above-the-ground, mausoleum-type vaults and the other refers to the more commonly used underground, single-casket boxes which have become quite popular lately.

These single-casket boxes are made of reinforced concrete, fiberglass, stainless steel or other mixtures of materials. The base of the vault is placed in the grave before the casket is lowered, after which the top of the vault is placed on and sealed if it is a "sealer" type.

One purpose of the vault is to protect the casket from the elements. This is not as frivolous as it may sound. When a casket begins to decay, in the normal course of events, the ground begins to sink in above it. Use of a vault keeps the ground level and the burial site far more neat and attractive. For this reason, many cemeteries now require a burial vault; others simply recommend it.


