"We didn't discuss that, but I'm sure we will be," Grant said. "There's been no discussion about an assistant director."

During the Thursday meeting, board president Sauter said he believed the assistant director's position should remain open for now.

"I'd kind of like to leave it there and vegetate for a while,"

Papal told the library board members she was looking forward to serving as director.

"I am just ecstatic," she said. "I did not anticipate this a month ago. I'll work very hard for you."

"I'm delighted, I'm just delighted," Papal said after the meeting. "I have long had an affinity for this library" and for the community.

PAPAL SERVED as assistant library director from July 1983 to May 1985. She served as coordinator of adult services and branch head from

July 1980 to July 1983.

Prior to that, she served as head, Richardson Department and Oakland County Subregional Library, from June 1973 to May 1979.

Papal, who is 35, holds a bachelor's degree in political science and secondary education certification from West Texas State University in Canyon, Texas. She received a master's degree in library science with a specialist in aging certification from Wayne State University in Detroit.

The new library director also holds a continuing education certificate in finance and accounting for non-profit institutions from the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania. She received the Loretta D. Ryan Award from the Michigan Library Association as "Young Librarian of the Year" in 1978.

In 1978, she participated as one of five national consultants for the U.S. Office of Education-sponsored study on "Public Library Services to the Handicapped."
