# Stars make show

Visitors can see the stars every Sat-urday night all summer at Cranbrook Institute of Science, site of the state's only observatory open to the public on a regular basis.

In addition to a multitude of celestial objects for viewing, there will be half-bour observatory demonstrations explaining telescope operation and use of the instrument if the sky is clear.

Jupiter and Saturn are excellent targets all season, and although it was not identified as a plante before 1878 and has been seen by very few people, Uranus possibly may be located low in the sky in Scorpius.

Also in the summer sky are the famous Ring Nebula and Milky Way, dou-

ble stars and great globular clusters containing thousands of stars.

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
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
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












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
