

Hills police honor two employees

Two employees of the Farmington Hills Police Department received citations Monday.

Officer Charles Hubbard and Dispatch Coordinator Jacquelyn Green

received their citations at the Monday meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council.

Hubbard, a 64-year veteran of the department, received a citation and medal of honor for his actions on the evening of March 14.

On that evening, Hubbard and two

other members of the surveillance unit were staking out the location of the Taco Bell restaurant on Grand River Avenue, in an effort to solve recent holdups that had occurred in the area.

Two people were seen walking in the area, after getting out of a car that was

parked nearby. Hubbard and one of the other officers saw one of the individuals inside the restaurant pointing a gun at an employee.

AFTER THE suspects left the restaurant, one of them, on two occasions, turned and pointed his gun in Hub-

bard's direction. Hubbard then shot him.

Before the suspect was transported to the hospital, Hubbard performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation on him. The suspect, an 18-year-old Detroit man, died as a result of the shooting.

Green, who has been with the department for more than six years, received two citations for her actions on May 30 and June 1.

On those days, she handled two incidents involving callers whose young children had stopped breathing. In both cases, she stayed on the line until rescue vehicles arrived, and instructed the callers on the steps to take to help get the youngsters breathing again.

During the council meeting Monday, a tape of a Channel 7 interview with Green was shown.

"I think the members of the department should be recognized in the public sector, too," Farmington Hills Police Chief William Dwyer said of the cita-

tions. "We're very proud of them, and we're very proud of this police department."

"I THINK these two people were very gratified that they were presented with the citations before the city council and the mayor. I think we should recognize people that perform an outstanding service for the community. Everybody likes a pat on the back, everybody likes to be recognized."

"That would be my plan for the future. It's my intent to make the community and the city administration aware of these outstanding achievements."

Both employees showed sensitivity in difficult situations, the police chief said.

"He (Hubbard) was faced with losing his life, and protecting the lives of some innocent bystanders. He went the extra mile when he performed the CPR. The sensitivity of both these people was just overwhelming to me."
