

Trial pending in shooting

After a preliminary examination Monday, Alvin Martin McFall was bound over for trial in connection with a May 28 shooting in Farmington Hills.

The preliminary exam was before Judge Michael Hand of the 47th District Court. Bond was continued at \$5,000.

"The trial date has not been set yet," said Farmington Hills Police Chief William Dwyer. "It will be soon."

McFall, of Redford Township, was charged with attempted murder, assault with intent to murder, and two counts of possession of a firearm while in the commission of a felony.

The charges stemmed from a shooting at a May 26 graduation party at 20954 Dunkirk in Farmington Hills. Witnesses told police that a fight broke out at the party. During the struggle, a shot was fired, striking Gary Scott Tasco of Detroit.

Tasco was transported to Botsford General Hospital in Farmington Hills. He was discharged from the hospital on June 14.

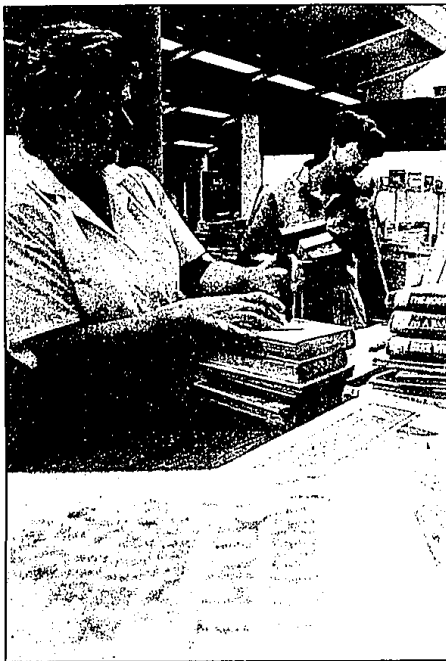

Library raises fines on overdue rentals

At the conclusion of the Farmington "Amnesty Week," fine notices will begin to be generated and sent to patrons directly from the computer center in Plymouth. Aug. 19 is the beginning date for the notices, which will be sent on a regular basis through the computerized circulation system.

"That's when they start going in the mail."

Aug. 19 is also the beginning date for the library's new fine structure. Most of the increases have been in the amounts set for the maximum fines, Bohrer said.

The new fines and the notices are intended to remind patrons to return materials promptly, she said.

"They're real key items in the collection." Materials needed for school assignments, for example, will soon be in heavy demand, as Farmington-area youngsters return to their classrooms.

The new fine charges are:

- Filmstrips, adult, young adult, juvenile: 10 cents per day fine, \$5 maximum fine, replacement cost of \$10 or list price, if known;
- Books, adult/young adult: 10 cents per day fine, \$5 maximum fine, replacement cost of \$15 or list price, if known;
