Language, computer classes slated

Computer and language learning programs will be available for the first time this September when the University of Detroit introduces continuing education programs into the educational offerings at its Clarkston Campus.
Among its varied offerings to working adults will be evening as well as daytime computer training seminars including introduction to the IBM-PC, LOTUS 1-2-3, Intermediate and advanced LOTUS 1-2-3, wordstar for word processing as well as BASIC and DBASE languages. Custom-designed company training can also be arranged on campus or on-site.
In addition, intensive 12-week foreign language classes in Japanese, French, German and Spanish, utilizing the nationally acclaimed "Dartmouth-Rassias" method, will be introduced in evening format 6-9 p.m. beginning Sept. 16 in classes meeting Mondays

and Wednesdays. The Dartmouth-Rassias method provides rapid acquisition of fluency with its emphasis on speaking skills.
One of the few colleges and universities in the Midwest to offer language learning by the Dartmouth method, the University of Detroit has been selected by many local and national corporations to prepare their executives for work abroad. Many other adults in the metro Detroit area have studied in the program to prepare for foreign travel or just for the satisfaction of learning to speak another language.
U-D also offers rapid language learning classes in these and other languages at its Melchior and Renaissance (Jefferson Avenue) Campuses.

Another type of language course — oral and written communication skills for business persons — will also be offered at U-D's Clarkston Campus. The eight-week course, beginning Sept. 16, will meet Monday evenings.
