Older people with knee arthritis are fearful of experiencing a fall. When the individual is moving forward to take the next step, a leg buckles, and the person falls. No preceding pain or unsteadiness gives a warning.

What has occurred is that the body anticipates that the next step will cause pain, and refuses to allow that step to occur. In most instances the potentially painful area is the knee joint which goes into flexion, rather than taking the normal weightbearing position of extension. The result is loss of balance and a fall.

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Prevention of give-way weakness requires two approaches. First, the individual needs treatment and control underlayment of hip and knee joints. Second, the person needs to be convinced of the need to walk with a cane, as it provides support when the leg cannot.
