OF THE 17 players on the roster, nine were prep all-staters in the past two years, and the others earned at least all-league accolades. That means that not only does Schoolcraft have talent, it has something last year's squad lacked — depth. Against Michigan State a year ago, for example, Schoolcraft had 11 able bodies, the bare minimum.
