Group interviews will be given at 10 a.m. Sept. 15 and 16. The eight-week empathy training course will meet from 9 a.m. until noon on Mondays and Wednesdays beginning Oct. 7.

Designed for those with an interest in helping women discover their potential, participants will learn how to de-

velop empathy listening skills and problem-solving techniques. Upon successful completion of the sessions, they are requested to serve as volunteer peer counselors three hours a week for a minimum of four months.

Individuals pay for 2.5 institutional credits of instruction. For further information, call or visit the center located in the second house south of the Schoolcraft Campus on Haggerty Road, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. daily and until 8 p.m. Wednesdays.
