

Lakers rip North netters

The West Bloomfield girls tennis team paired off against a couple of Farmington schools and came away with a pair of wins.

The Lakers, 2-0, edged North Farmington, 4-3, Wednesday and downed Farmington Harrison, 7-0, Thursday. Laura Swidler, Michelle Gurtz and Anne Scavone each had wins in both matches.

Swidler beat Ann Heimbuch of North Farmington (6-0, 6-0) and Amy Jacobs of Harrison (6-4, 6-2) in No. 2 singles. Gurtz routed the Raiders' Carrie Lee (7-6, 6-1) and the Hawks' Dana Morrison (6-0, 6-0) in No. 3 action. Scavone knocked off Pam Grestler of North Farmington (7-6, 6-1) and Beth Mendelson of Harrison (6-2, 6-0) in No. 4 competition.

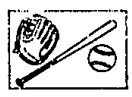
