Use the right tool for the job

With the rising labor cost of profes-sional craftsmen, more and more homeowners and other do-it-yourselfers are making their own repairs to save money.

In the process of performing the unfamiliar electrical, plumbing or carpentry work, the novice may also be facing the task with hand tools ei-ther not suited for the job or misusing the one to how The carpit are to the ones he has. The results can be devastating, ranging from damaging costly material and tools to serious personal injury, according to the Hand Tools Institute.

This can be avoided if the tool user follows some simple rules. First, be certain that the hand tools to be used are the correct ones to do the job. For example, many persons are surprised to learn that there are at least 10 dif-ferent types of wrenches, over 50 types of pliers, 12 types of screwdrivers, 15 types of hammers and many other tools that can save hours of labor and give the job a professional look

HTI also recommends the use of safety goggles when working with hand tools. Chances are you will be picking up a variety of tools on any given job. While some have more potential for personal injury than others. it pays to protect your eyes for the duration of the project.

Here are some added pointers:

 Plastic covered nlier handles are for comfort only, not protection from electrical current.

· Claw hammers are for driving and removing common, unhardened nails. Don't strike other steel tools haus. Don't strike other steel tools such as chisels, punches or masonry nails with a claw bammer. • When working with a wrench, always pull the wrench — never push

the wrench.

 Never use an axe to strike a wood-splitting wedge - use a wood-chopper's maul or a sledge and never

Never use any struck tool, such as a chisel or punch that is chipped or mushroomed. Discard it.

 Always make certain the screwdriver tip fits snugly in the slot of the screw. A loose fit can mar the in-volved equipment or cause personal

Injury.
Never use an extension bar such as a length of pipe to increase lever-age on a wrench. This could result in breakage of the wrench and personal

 Ball peen hammers of appropriate alze or hand drilling hammers should be used to strike chisels, punches and star drills. Do not use the claw hammer.
