Customers who pick a preferred long-distance company will be connected to their choices when they dial "!" for long distance. Those customers who do not choose other companies will be connected to the AT&T long-distance network when they dial "!" to place calls.

AT&T operators will continue to

serve all customers who dial zero for help in an emergency, regardless of which long distance carrier the cus-tomer has selected for "dial 1" access. The operators also provide other assist-ance, such as granting immediate cred-it on AT&T calls that customers misdi-al.

DURING SEPTEMBER, Michigan Bell will send a letter to Farmington Hills customers explaining the selection process.
