

Week designated for adult day-care centers

The week of Sept. 22-28 has been designated National Adult Day Care Center Week.

Day care centers across Michigan, all members of the Michigan Association of Adult Day Care Centers, will be focusing attention on the concept of day care as an alternative for the frail elderly.

"Not all handicapped elderly need nursing home placement or 24-hour care. With some support services, the frail can remain in their homes or the homes of relatives. The adult day care center is an important support service that can provide an alternative to institutionalization, as well as providing some relief to the care-giving spouses, children or other relatives," said Jan Dolan, affiliated with Orchard Hills Adult Day Care Center.

The adult care centers provides personal care and supervision by professional and paraprofessional staff for the frail elderly in a group setting. Many of these centers offer programs of exercise, physical therapy, activities, reality orientation and socialization. These programs may help in pro-

viding for the rehabilitation or maintenance of its elderly clients.

"SERVICES OF this kind can indeed forestall or eliminate the need for institutional placement," Dolan said.

Today there are at least 15.5 million Americans ages 65 to 74. Another nine million are 75 and older and are the fastest growing group in the population. It is a segment of this second tiering some of the frailties or debilitating conditions such as Alzheimer's disease and other dementias often associated with aging.

This group is also at great risk of losing independence through institutionalization.
