The bride-to-be is a graduate of Western Michigan University, em-

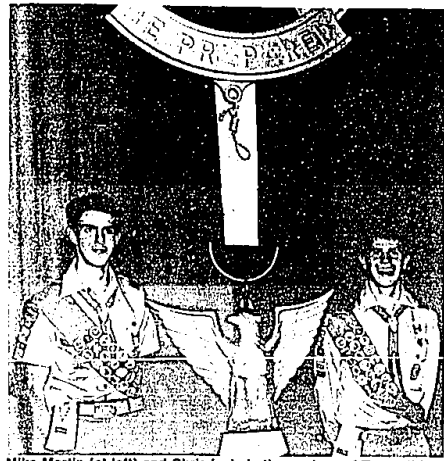
played as a speech and language clinician in Davenport, Iowa. Her fiancé is a graduate of Harrison High School and Western Michigan University. He is self-employed.
