AFTER SCHOOL RECREATION — The activity flyers have been distributed through the Farmington area schools for registration for the fall session of the After School Programs. Classes will include gymnastics, rhythmic gymnastics, ballet, jazz, woodworking, kid's kitchen, cartooning and more. Classes will be offered at Edgemoor, Flanders and Lakeshore elementary schools beginning the week of Oct. 7.

CPR CLASSES SET — This American Red Cross program is a nine-hour comprehensive class and refresher course. The session will run Tuesday, Oct. 15, Thursday, Oct. 17 and Tuesday, Oct. 22. Classes will be held at O.E. Dunckel Middle School and will run 7-10 p.m. The class fee is \$5 and includes books and handouts. Pre-registration is required for this class.

HUNTER'S SAFETY CLINIC — In accordance with Michigan state law, participation in a certified Hunter's Safety Clinic is required for all youth 12-18 years of age wishing to purchase their first hunting license. This 10-hour course is designed to teach all aspects of hunter's safety and after successful completion of the course, a hunter's certificate will be issued. The clinic will begin at 6 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 15 at the Farmington Hills Library. Pre-registration is required at the Parks and Recreation office.

WINERY'S TOUR SET — Visit western Michigan and tour the famous wineries of Bronckos and St. Julian's and taste test some of Michigan's best wines. We will lunch at Charron's on the Lake and enjoy a menu of lake perch, prime rib and cannelloni before our tour of the wineries. Then a stop at Cornwall's Turkeyville, U.S.A. will complete our day. 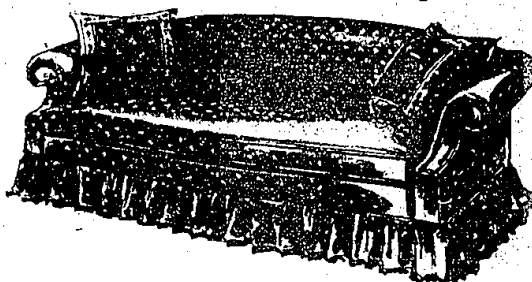

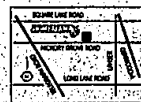
