is active in Women's American ORT, and has served on the ORT board of directors, as chairman of various committees, and as vice president of special events.

She is also a life member of Hadassah, a member of Maimonides Society and is a volunteer counselor and faculty member at "The Haven."

MILLER SERVED in World War II as a U.S. Navy hospital corpsman in the Pacific area. He earned his doctorate of osteopathy degree at Kirksville College of Osteopathic Medicine and served his internship and surgical residency at Detroit Osteopathic Hospital.

He has been the attending senior surgeon at Detroit Osteopathic, Bi-County Community, Oakland General, Pontiac Osteopathic and William Beaumont hospitals. He has also served as chairman and acting chairman, department of surgery at Detroit Osteopathic and Bi-County Hospitals, and has served on those hospitals' executive committees.

Miller is a clinical professor of surgery at Michigan College of Osteopathic Medicine and Michigan State University and is a faculty member of American College of Osteopathic Surgeons, teaching post-graduate courses in surgery. From 1973 to the present, he has served as chairman, moderator or speaker in more than 30 professional seminars, panels, assemblies and conferences held throughout the U.S. as well as in Canada, the USSR, Mongolia and China.

In 1981 the American College of Osteopathic Surgeons named him "Distinguished Osteopathic Surgeon of the Year."

Miller is a Fellow of the American College of Osteopathic Obstetricians and Gynecologists and is secretary/treasurer to the American Osteopathic Board of Surgery.

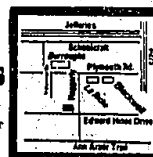
