## Glass Cleanup Is Paying Proposition

Anyone who wants to help clean up the environment and make a little money will have an opportunity during the Plymouth Fall Festival weekend.

LIFE (Let's Implement Favorable Environment), the pollution action group of the Plymouth American Association of University Women, will pay contributors a penny for each four pounds of glass turned in to them.

All old jars and bottles will be accepted, even broken ones. However, they must be clean, without caps or lids and sorted by color into groups of clear, green and brown.

All glass collected will be recycled by the Owens-Illinois Glass Co. of Toledo, which will grind it into cullet, a by-product used in glass making.

Members of LIFE, (People for Environmental Progress), who are assisting with the round-up, will arrange to pick up glass for those who have no way of getting it to the collection site. They are asked to call Jim Neal at 453-1067 before Saturday, Sept. 12.

THE GLASS ROUND-UP collection site will also serve as a drop-off point for a paper drive being held by First United Methodist Church of Plymouth the same weekend.

Newspapers must be bundled or stuffed into large paper bags. Loose bags must be bundled and corrugated cardboard boxes will be accepted if they are flattened and banded.
