## Jews To Mark Rosh Ha-Shonah

This year, on Oct. 1 and 2, Jews all over the world will gather in synagogues for observance of Rosh Ha-Shonah, their New Year.

Rosh Ha-Shonah is the beginning of the 10 days of penitence when Jewish law is called upon to look back at their way of life in the year gone by and to seek ways in which it can be better in the future. Rosh Ha-Shonah is the time Jews reaffirm their faith in God.

The sounding of the shofar — the ram's horn — in the synagogue heralds the beginning of the ten days of penitence. In the story of Abraham and Isaac, a ram was substituted for Isaac as a sacrifice. On Rosh Ha-Shonah, with the sound of the shofar, man is reminded to give himself in the service of God.

Even prior to the days of Rosh Ha-Shonah, the prayers known as Selichot, are recited in the synagogue. The Selichot service is composed of a group of special prayers asking forgiveness for any wrong done in the past year before entering a new year.

## Religion Update

Certain Baptist bonds are becoming as questionable an investment as gold bricks, or title deeds to the Brooklyn Bridge, according to security reports from the Wall Street Journal and other financial periodicals.

Yet these reports are either not read or are unheeded by devout people who sink their money into a \$500 million bond market that includes such institutions as "Bethel Baptist University."

PIOUS INVESTORS poured more than \$1 million into this Oklahoma enterprise only to learn, after its operators had vanished, that it had never been accredited and that its final enrollment had been four students.

Such shearing of the sheep is not rare.

One promoter arranged a \$20,000 bond issue for a small Arkansas church — but sold \$40,000 worth, skipping town with the difference.

The Golden Circle Gospel Foundation sold \$44,000 worth of what it claimed were church bonds — and then tried to invest the money in a Santa Barbara oil exploration firm when the Securities and Exchange Commission caught up with them.

Clude M. Bond, of Gideon Church Builders, was permanently enjoined from selling bonds issued by 30 churches in the Dallas-Ft. Worth area. The SEC charged that Bond had misled investors by telling them: "There never has been a known defaulted church bond."

NOT ONLY investors but many state and municipal governments have proven exceptionally naive about such practices. For church sponsorship of such bond issues.

church's property is worth \$3 million), Rev. Driscoll was indicted in May on 13 counts of conspiracy, fraud in the sale of securities and mail fraud.

The indictment specifies that Rev. Driscoll and co-defendants Hugh McGee, Paul McMillan and Clyde Fabun of Houston repeatedly issued new series of bonds to cover payments which they knew the church could not make upon exercising the bonds.


But apparently neither Pastor Driscoll nor his flock are fazed by the indictment. He has promised a solution that will leave the church "with its honor and goodness intact. Give us 45 days and we will work it out."

## Rabbi Wine To Describe Russian Trip

Rabbi Sherwin Wine of Birmingham Temple is devoting several sermons in September to discussions of his recent travels in Eastern Europe.

## Computers Cut Costs

An initial saving of \$40,000 a year on collection envelope costs alone is expected by approximately 200 Archdiocese of Detroit parishes as a result of a merger of existing computer services. Each can save an average of \$200 a year.

"This is a promising start in cost-cutting which should grow as others of the 36 Detroit-area Catholic parishes adopt computerized services," said Dr. Arthur X. Deegan, director of the Archdiocese Office of Planning and Research.

"A study conducted by a firm of accountants has shown opportunities for economy by eliminating duplicated mailing lists while computer services are diversified into other fields of parish and institutional management.

Groundwork for the agreement was laid by James L. Bond, of the information systems division of Dr. Deegan's office.
