

Despite protest, spa owner vows to open

Over objections from residents, township board members, students and adjoining merchants, his health spa will open, Korean-born Jin Sung Chung told about 100 people at a township board meeting Tuesday.

Nearly 1,000 petitions signed by residents and merchants were submitted Tuesday night to the West Bloomfield Township Board by Richard Baker, Pine Lake Estates subdivision president.

"We asked the board to do their civic and moral duty to prevent this from opening," said Baker.

But township Supervisor John Doherty said, "We know of no law to prevent this. Whatever we do, we must follow existing laws."

Westley Honer, owner of Honer's Bloomfield West shopping strip, signed a three-year lease with Chung for the

spa at 4476 Orchard Lake Road. Chung, a U.S. citizen, said he has spent three months renovating the store, which has four massage rooms, two saunas, showers and exercise equipment.

In HALTING English, Chung said, "Every time inspector come we tear out. They check my whole back-ground."

Honer's attorney said, "As far as we know he hasn't done anything wrong. It's a legitimate business."

Fraught of boycotts, a court injunction and picketing of the spa have been made and a suggestion that the \$1,500 a month lease be bought out by concerned residents.

"It's inappropriate to have it so close," said West Bloomfield High School student Jayme Leib. She told the township board she and other students go to the 7-Eleven and Little Caesar's

at lunchtime. Leib is the daughter of Trustee Jeffrey Leib.

Harvey Babcock, Lone Pine Estates subdivision president, said, "This attracts immoral activity. One thing leads to another. We just don't want that here."

He and others referred to the recent arrest of 16 Korean women for prostitution at five Farmington Hills oriental spas.

WEST BLOOMFIELD Police Chief Alfred McGhee said, "I know the connotation. One man was charged in Farmington Hills, but that hasn't been adjudicated."

Chung said only he and his sister will be employed to give massages. State licenses are not required.

"Please give me a chance," Chung asked. "We open the business then if anybody complains, we leave."

Neighboring beauty salon operator Jerry Rozycki objected, "If there is no

law against such an establishment, it would be in order to pass a new law because it is so close to a school."

Doherty suggested legal problems should be addressed at the state level.

Rev. John Freed, pastor of Holy Spirit Lutheran Church, said, "We have ideals in our community. As citizens we should speak up to the man who owns the shopping center (Honer) who allowed this man (Chung) to come in."

"The problem is in Farmington Hills. Until that is settled couldn't we put a ban on this? It's the same kind of operation," said Gordon Muir, a Chamber of Commerce and Optimist Club member.

Asked why he needed four massage rooms for two employees, Chung explained, "One hour massages means we have to change sheets to change rooms. If there are complaints we will close." Chung said he has previously worked as a masseuse in the Grand Rapids area.
