Refinancing your house may save you money

For the 1.5 million boneowners with mortgage rates of 15 percent or more, now is the time to consider refinancing. Generally speaking, it makes sense to renegoliate your mortgage when rates are at least 2 percent below the rates of your existing loan.

Rates on 30-year fixed-rate mortgages have been consistently 13 per-cept or less for a number of months. But they may start inching upward be-fore the end of the year.

But if your mort-age has been sold into secondary mar-ket, as often happens, you will have to go through another form of closing.
