

Adult Night Classes Are Listed By Clarenceville

The schedule for 1970 fall term adult education classes in Clarenceville School District is announced by Robert V. Young, adult education director.

Registration will be held from 7 to 9 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday, Sept. 15-17, in Clarenceville High School. Clarenceville non-residents may also attend classes.

Those who cannot register in person are asked to contact Young at 475-2522 or 475-2070.

Classes will begin Sept. 21. Most will meet for 12 two-hour sessions, although some will meet for 10 two-hour sessions.

FEES ARE PAYABLE at registration. Fees for most classes are \$9 for a single registration and \$15 for a husband and wife enrolling during the same term. (It need not be the same class). There is no extra charge for non-residents.

No refunds will be given after the second meeting of a class, and a \$1 service fee will be retained from those dropping the course prior to the second meeting.

Any course may be started by a group of 15 or more. Such a group should contact Young.

Class offerings are as follows:

MONDAY—Powder Put Woodshop, a course covering project construction, repair, refinishing and antiquing. Offered for women only. Typing I, a course with emphasis on parts of the machine, correct posture, fingering and basic letter styles. Oil Painting, a course for those who would like to learn to paint in oils or perfect their skills.

TUESDAY—Machine and Bench Woodworking, an open shop for simple to complex projects. Class members may use full facilities of woodshop to build from scratch, repair, or refinish most any wood project.

Knitting I, a course designed to teach the basics of Office Machines, a course for those who wish to learn

operation of various office machines including the full keyboard adding machine, 10-key adding machine, rotary calculator, key driven calculator, printing calculator and transcriber.

WEDNESDAY—Beginning and Advanced Sewing, a course for those who wish to learn the techniques for cutting and fitting a pattern, seams, zippers and the finer details of sewing.

Wednesday and Thursday—Lapidary I and II, a course with primary emphasis on cutting, grinding, sanding and polishing semi-precious stones.

THURSDAY—Short-hand I, a course designed to teach the basic principles of Gregg shorthand including vocabulary, brief forms and

phrases, dictation and transcription.

Driver Education will be taught with the class meeting by calculator, key driven calculator, printing calculator and transcriber.

Adult Basic Education classes will be available for both native and foreign born adults, 18 or over. Classes will offer basic skills at the elementary and junior high levels. As the classes are financed through federal and state funds, there is no charge for tuition or materials. Special classes in English for foreign born also will be offered.

In addition, classes will be offered free of charge for those people who wish to complete their high school training and receive a high school diploma.

Cranbrook Sets Adult Classes

Fall can mean back to school for adults, too.

Whether it's for courses that give introduction to science or practice for the hobbyist or serious college credit classes, Cranbrook Institute of Science is again offering adult education courses beginning Sept. 22.

"LAPIDARY Techniques" gives practical instruction in sawing, grinding and polishing of semi-precious stones. Two sections of the eight-week work-shop run Thursdays, Sept. 17 through Nov. 5 from 7 to 10 p.m., and Saturdays, Sept. 19 through Nov. 7 from 9 a.m. to noon. Brian Lickey is instructor. Fee is \$30 for the non-credit course.

"Fall Wildflowers" includes laboratory plant study and field trips to local wildflower areas. Limited enrollment is available for Saturdays, Sept. 19 through Oct. 10 from 9 a.m. to noon. Dr. James R. Wells is instructor of the non-credit class. Fee is \$15.

THE INSTITUTE will co-sponsor four courses with Oakland University.

"Basic Astronomy" is a background on the solar sys-

tem and the universe with sessions in the planetarium and observatory, weather permitting, using the Institute's six-inch refracting telescope. Star charts, desk-top celestial spheres and other teaching aids are studied. William Schultz Jr. is instructor of the course meeting Tuesdays, Sept. 22 through Nov. 24 from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. Fee is \$30 for the non-credit course.

"Photography" includes camera techniques of composition, exposure, developing, printing and mounting using institute darkroom facilities. Class meets Tuesdays, Sept. 22 through Nov. 24 from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m., instructed by Miles H. Barrie. Fee for the non-credit course is \$35 plus \$5 for materials.

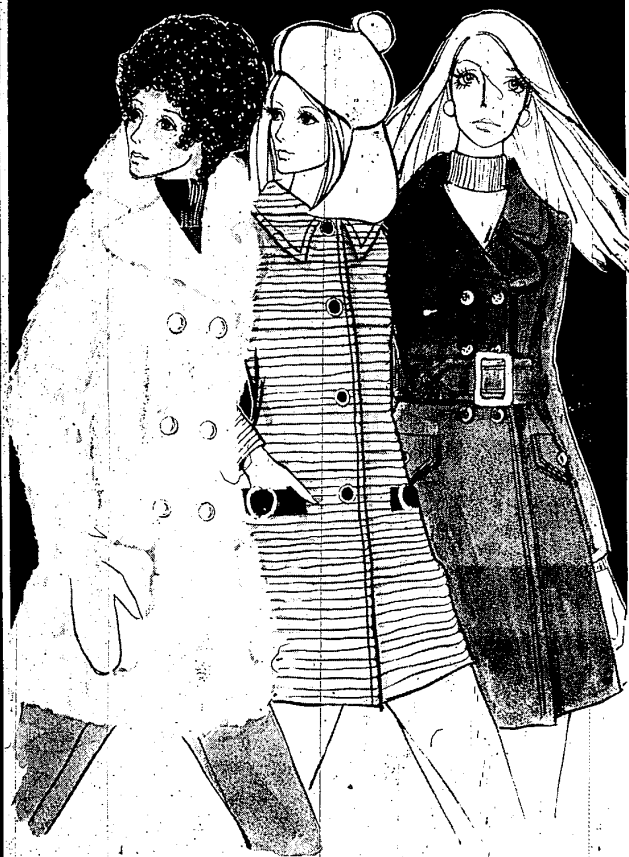
