teachers will be manning the various classrooms," Allen said.

LAST YEAR, teachers voted to strike if they had no contract, but yesterday's meeting was

the first this summer for the FEA.

"The issues will be settled when the board of education decides to begin negotiating," Allen commented.

The school district's head negotiator disputed most of the FEA's claims and called their demands "rather unrealistic,"

With increases in Blue Cross costs, Bartman said, if present coverage is maintained, "the district can't afford to do other things."

Another area of the extra duty question concerns coaches' pay, Bartman pointed out. The district proposed to give coaches a substantial raise in exchange for flat rate payments for other extra duty assignments.

"We even inserted a grandfather clause to protect those now with the district," Bartman said.

The negotiator's primary complaint against the FEA was that the teachers refuse to look at the overall picture.

Bartman said negotiations were moving well until the salary and fringe benefit packages were introduced.

"Their demands are just beyond the reach of the district," he said.

He added that the two sides are as much as \$300 apart on salary schedules. He charged that the teachers have not budged from their original demands.

Bartman also commented on the fringe benefit proposals.

The district's representative agreed with Allen's plan to call

in a fact finder.

"They're matters of dollars and cents. Let a fact finder decide on these issues," Bartman said.
