

# police/fire calls

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week:

## CAR VANDALIZED

Two Detroit men allegedly broke into a car parked outside a Farmington Hills condominium in an apparent attempt to steal the AM/FM cassette radio.

Arrested Nov. 14 before District Judge Margaret Schaeffer, Henry Lee Hill, 30, and Kyle Aaron Johnson, 20, stood mute to single counts of breaking and entering of an automobile. Conviction of the felony could bring a maximum penalty of five years in prison or a \$1,000 fine.

Schaeffer set bond at \$5,000, 10 percent of which must be posted to gain release pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court.

Hill and Johnson allegedly pried open the passenger door of a 1984 Ford parked in a carport at the 12th Estate Condos about 9:30 p.m. Nov. 13.

According to a police report, an officer saw the suspects drive through the condo complex, then park near the Ford. A short time later, the suspects left and drove to a nearby apartment complex. After cruising that complex, the suspects returned to the 12th Estate and again parked next to the Ford. The officer watched as the men entered the car.

After the men left the scene in their car, the officer discovered that the Ford's dashboard had been smashed and that the radio was dangling from wires underneath.

The suspects were arrested a short time later at a nearby gas station.

## ASSAULT ALLEGED

Arnold Ledford Hopkins, 45, of Farmington Hills is scheduled to stand trial on a charge of criminal sexual conduct-second degree (sexual contact) in connection with a Nov. 7 incident against an 8-year-old girl in a Farm-

ington Hills apartment.

Following a preliminary examination Friday, District Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington bound Hopkins over for trial in Oakland County Circuit Court. He is being held in the Oakland County Jail in lieu of \$10,000 bond. Conviction of the felony could bring a maximum penalty of 15 years in prison.

At his district court arraignment Nov. 7, Hopkins stood mute before Schaeffer.

Hopkins is wanted in Florida, where the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Department has a warrant charging him with lewd assault on children. Extradition is pending, according to police.

## ASSAULT ALLEGED

A female shop employee at Chesley Industries, 20775 Chesley, was allegedly assaulted by a male co-worker Nov. 14, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.

According to the report, the incident occurred after lunch when the woman tried to retrieve a portable fan allegedly taken by the co-worker. The man allegedly struck the woman and pushed her into a steel pipe.

After pulling a steel pipe from a crate, the man held the pipe over his head, allegedly threatening to hit the woman. A plant foreman stepped between the two, according to the public safety report.

Both workers were suspended Friday pending investigation by Chesley Industries management.

## MARIJUANA SUSPECTED

Two 22-year-old Southfield men were ticketed under city ordinance for allegedly violating the controlled substance act.

A pipe containing suspected marijuana was found in their possession when they were sitting in a van in the lot at Putt 'n' Games, 30749 Grand River, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

## FIVE TICKETED

Three Farmington Hills men and two Brighton men were ticketed in two separate incidents Friday for alleged "open alcohol in vehicle" ordinance violations, according to Farmington Department of Public Safety reports.

The first incident occurred early Friday morning at the Farmington Coin Op Auto Wash, 22833 Orchard Lake. Two 20-year-olds and one 19-year-old, all Farmington Hills residents, were ticketed.

In both instances, open cans/bottles of beer were confiscated, officers said.
