The recount was conducted in least time this year because only approximately 5,000 ballots had to be recounted compared to the more than 30,000 in last year's presidential and special city council election, she said.

Canvassers last week hand-checked each ballot to be sure the chads — recelangular perforations on the punch card ballots — were properly detached, Altman said. At least two corners of the four-cornered clad must be detached for it to be counted as a vote. After the ballots were checked, votes were totaled by computer.

"IT WAS a very, very minor discrepancy — adjustment," Allman said, about this year's recount. "This was a very, very clean and effective recount."

Both Seyer and Grant lauded county canvassers and Reynolds and her staff for the manner in which the recount was conducted.

"I found them (canvassers) to be extremely conscientious in their responsibility to the voters," Grant said.
