Right of Creditors

State laws about your creditors' rights are complicated. Whether you own property separately or jointly can influence how much of your assets your creditors can reach, so get legal counsel.

Many misinformed couples hold their assets jointly in the believe that the right of survivorship would keep their assets out of probate court and eliminate the need for wills.


