Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week:

ASSAULT ALLEGED

A 22-year-old Novi man faces felonious assault, malicious destruction of police property and three misdemeanor charges in connection with a high-speed chase through Farmington Hills late Wednesday.

Arrested Thursday before District Judge Michael Hand of Farmington, Da'nyl Kevin Stewart stood mute to single counts of felonious assault, malicious destruction of police property, failure to obey the signal of a police officer, operating under the influence of liquor and leaving the scene of a personal injury accident.

Stewart was released on \$1,000 bond pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court. The two felony charges carry maximum penalties upon conviction of four years in prison.

According to police reports: A security officer noticed Stewart sleeping in his pickup truck in the Bedford General Hospital lot at 9:45 p.m. Wednesday. When Stewart appeared to be intoxicated after awakening, Farmington Hills Police directed him not to drive and offered to help him call for a ride. He declined help, however, and walked to the hospital to, as he told police, use the telephone.

Ten minutes later, Stewart got back inside the pickup and hit a telephone pole support cable before pulling onto westbound Grand River. An officer in a

semlarked patrol car tried to stop Stewart but he allegedly ran a red light at Middlebelt en route to westbound M-102. Speeds reached 95 mph. Near Gill, Stewart slowed and allegedly steered into the passenger side of the patrol car, sending it into the median.

The chase continued onto westbound I-96 into Novi. When traffic became heavier near Novi Road, the chase was called off but the officer in the semlarked patrol car continued to follow the pickup. Stewart exited at southbound Beck, then allegedly ran a red light and a stop sign before broadsiding a car at Eight Mile. The collision sent the pickup into a tree on the southwest corner of Eight Mile and Beck and the driver of the car to Providence Hospital-Nowi for treatment.

Stewart, meanwhile, allegedly fled into Mayberry State Park, where officers from six police agencies found him asleep in the snow after a 40-minute search. Following his arrest, Stewart had to be restrained, police allege.

ARBON DETERMINED

A maliciously set fire caused about \$500 in damage to an outside wall at the Green Thumb Lawn Mower, 24233 Orchard Lake, about 6:50 a.m. Thursday.

The fire burned a hole through to the inside of the business. The manager of a nearby gas station first noticed it. "The fire started by placing some combustibles within the cracks of the wood siding and igniting the materials," Lt. Peter Baldwin of the Farmington Hills Fire Department said. "We ruled out any natural cause."

Baldwin urges anyone with information about the fire to call investigator Gary Micu at 555-0744.

The fire was similar to one that burned itself out at the same location this summer, before Green Thumb moved in, Baldwin said.

FIRE DOUSED

Employees of Max and Erma's restaurant, 31205 Orchard Lake, used a portable extinguisher to douse a fire in a trash basket in a restroom Thursday night.

The cause of the fire was improper disposal of a cigarette, said Lt. Peter Baldwin of the Farmington Hills Fire Department.
