Last spring's merging of Detroit's two largest agencies providing training and employment for handicapped persons is expected to create opportunities for more diversified rehabilitation services for a large number of people than the totals of the agencies operating separately.

Refresher Courses Offered To Nurses

Michigan nurses who are not presently working are urged to take free refresher courses under the Manpower Development and Training Act. Fall courses begin Sept. 14.

Federal monies are available for these courses which are sponsored by the Michigan Nurses' Association, the Michigan Employment Security Commission, and the Division of Vocational Education of the Michigan State Dept. of Education.

They include 240 hours of theory and supervised clinical practice, and are designed to update the inactive registered nurse's skills.
