church and residential growth, this is no time for a change of good inspectors."

JERNIGAN GOT his license as an electrician about three years ago, Crook claims. Since then, Crook adds, Jernigan has operated the Rex Automatic Laundry on Grand River just east of Orchard Lake in the City of Farmington.

It has been reported Jernigan has done some work, under the permit of the Sisson Electric Co., at a trailer park in Lyon Township being developed by a real estate company which includes Hall as a partner.

The company was incorporated Sept. 24, 1967, under the name "Kensington Place" and lists as its address 33314 Grand River. That is the address of the law offices of Joseph T. Brennan, Farmington Township attorney.

THE ASSUMED NAMES division of Oakland County Clerk's office lists as partners in the company: Hall, Mrs. Leola Cairns, William Taylor of the township's Building Department; Douglas and Herbert Schenk. Brennan is listed as resident agent.

The company purchased the land in Lyon Township and

began developing the trailer park shortly after Douglas Schenk sold his interest in the former trailer park on Orchard Lake Rd. now site of the Top's Department Store under construction.

Schenk was first contacted by representatives of Top's in September of 1967. The deal was closed in August 1968 with official papers signed in October 1968.

The B-3 zoning for the Orchard Lake site was approved by the township board to allow expansion of the trailer park which then existed. The B-3 also allowed location of the Top's Store.

The initial payment to Schenk was \$360,000 according to Marshall Goldman who is a real estate broker from Aurora, Ill., hired by Top's to make feasibility studies on the Farmington Township site.

HALL TOLD this newspaper he has known Jernigan for many years, before he was elected supervisor 10 years ago. His acquaintance with Jernigan was on a "business basis," Hall added, and they were not personal friends.

Hall explained Jernigan has done some work for him on the trailer park in South Lyons and also did some work in the former Best Oldsmobile building now being used as a swimming pool sales outlet.

Hall owns the building on Grand River in the City of Farmington and leases it to the swimming pool company.

JERNIGAN WILL be a full time electrical inspector for the township. Hall explained and added that he was a "good, qualified electrician."

The supervisor continued: "Naturally, the fact that I know him was one of the reasons I approached him and one of the reasons he got the job."

Hall said Crook has been asked to work half-days because of his age. Crook is over 75 years old, Hall explained, and "by his own admission has trouble with his sense of balance."

It is hazardous for Crook to be climbing around buildings making inspections, Hall concluded, because he could fall and seriously injured.
