Sumi-E teacher says goodbye

Mary Bowman, the artist who introduced Japanese brush painting to hundreds of students in southeast Michigan over the past 11 years, will be leaving the area immediately after the holidays. She and her husband, George, will move to a retirement area in San Antonio, Tex.

Bowman began teaching the art of Sumi-E in Farmington Community Center almost immediately after taking up residence in Farmington Hills. From there her Sumi-E classes, Japanese tea ceremonies, workshops for

graduate credits, Japanese flower arranging, cooking, culture, and special seminars spread out to students of every grade level and to community houses throughout the greater metro area.

"I'm leaving my classes in good hands," she said. "Jo Chipelli is taking over for the winter terms in Farmington Community Center, Birmingham Community House and Southfield Civic Center. I highly recommend her. Grosse Pointe Memorial and the east sides found another teacher for the classes there."

The Jewish Welfare Federation's annual Super Sunday telephone appeal has been set for Feb. 2. The event is expected to reach nearly 10,000 households throughout the metropolitan area.

Shelby Tauber of Franklin and N. Brewster Broder of Pleasant Ridge have been chosen to chair the massive telethon, which raises funds for local

Broder, who chaired last year's Super Sunday, also is a member of Fed-

eration's Board of Governors and has been honored by several organizations for his communal commitment. He has led the Allied Jewish Campaign's Real Estate and Building Trades Division and is a lifetime board member of the Jewish Community Center. Broder is a former board member of the American Red Cross and the United Way of Michigan.

Bowling for handicapped


