Police facility slated to open this summer

cmployees now working in the 7.500square-foot offices attached to city halt
it 11 Mile and Orchard Lake roads.

The entire project — building, site
improvements, architectural design,
cquipment, and moving and furnishings
— will cost 33.4 million, Costick sald. A
construction contract was approved for
33 million — \$25 million for the building and \$500,000 for site improveneots.


will be triangular-shaped with a court-yard between the new building and ex-isting city administrative offices.

THE NEW building will provide ex-panded space for all police functions, including a new self-contained commu-nications center for dispatch that will offer restroom and kitchen facilities.

A training room, a press room, con-ference rooms, expanded lockerrooms, evidence storage areas and a three-bay automobile service area will be provid-

City officials plan to "put together a proposal to analyze what to do with the old building," Costick sald.

But more than likely, current police offices will be occupied by city administrative workers also working under cramped conditions. "It's very crowded now in almost every department," Costick said.
