## Sacred Heart hosts open house Feb. 2

Academy of the Sacred Heart will host an Open House 2-4 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 2, for prospective students in pre-kindergarten through grade 12. Sister Martha Houghan, headmistress of the academy, will deliver a welcoming address at 2 p.m. in the school auditorium.

The academy is an independent, Catholic college preparatory day school for boys and girls in pre-kindergarten through grade 4 and for girls only in grades 5-12. The Open House will offer guests the opportunity to visit classrooms, discover the curriculum and meet the faculty and students.

The upper school offers advanced placement courses, a student exchange program, a required community service program, and project term, an independent learning project, in addition to the regular college-preparatory curriculum.

Four scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic merit each year in the upper school.

Applicants for grades 9-12 are encouraged to take the academy's high school scholarship and entrance exam given every fall.

The school is administered by the Religious of the Sacred Heart and educates students of varied faiths and backgrounds from 39 Detroit metropolitan communities. The academy, which was established in 1851, is part of an international network of 250 Sacred Heart Schools and colleges, and is one of the oldest continuing independent schools in Michigan.

Financial aid for qualified applicants is awarded annually on the basis of need.

Academy of the Sacred Heart is located at 1250 Kensington Road in Bloomfield Hills, between Long Lake and Wattle Road.

## Detroit Jazz Orchestra comes to OCC Campus

At 8 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 8, the Smith Theatre on the Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College, located at 1-695 and Orchard Lake Road, will present an evening of jazz with Donald Walden and the Detroit Jazz Orchestra.

The Detroit Jazz Orchestra is one of the most unique concepts in the evolution of modern jazz in Detroit. It is the outgrowth of a project undertaken by Detroit Jazz Orchestra director Walden in 1982 when he was awarded a grant by Michigan Council for the Arts to write for an ensemble of five strings and a traditional jazz quintet.

The Detroit Jazz Orchestra is the only elite contemporary jazz orchestra in the nation. Besides providing a vehicle for composers and soloists, the orchestra also seeks to provide a medium for the arranger to work within.

The orchestra has been critically acclaimed and enthusiastically received at the Montreux-Detroit International Jazz Festival, on a WTVS Channel 50 Special titled, "Masters of Music," in concerts at Orchestra Hall and Rickenbacker Auditorium.

Walden and the Detroit Jazz Orchestra were chosen to receive one of four 1984-85 Governor's Arts Awards, which were presented to arts organizations who have contributed the most to the advancement of the arts in Michigan.

Walden sees its growth as an opportunity for young, modern composers to have their works performed and to expand the performing opportunities of the traditional jazz artist as well as classically trained artist.

An optional pre-concert dinner, prepared by the campus's award-winning culinary arts department, will be offered.

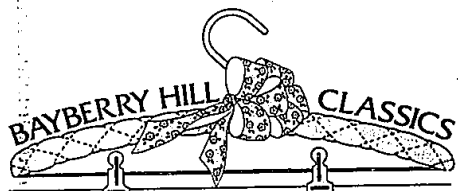
